
recent 2023 poll suggests that nearly two in three Americans are taking their shoes off before entering the home, but do not necessarily request that their guests remove their shoes.




shoes have multiple crevices that can hold dirt and bacteria, so the practice of taking them off has proven to keep germs from shoes out of the home.
