

Bring Home the Sound of the Seashore

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She puts the seashell to her ear and listens...

The beautiful sound of waves rolling into the shore makes her smile and reminds her of sweet holiday memories spent on the beach with her best friends.

BY picking up a conch shell and listening to that wonderful whooshing sound, many of us may have had this same experience that seems to bring childhood memories alive!

Introducing your children or grandkids to this activity can be magical and fun, so let's explore the inner workings of this phenomenon.

Larger conchs are the best type of shell to use for this activity, but any variety that contains an arch and canal shape will deliver some level of sound effect. Depending upon the shell's size and shape, different frequencies are produced, which determines the sound you may hear. Additionally, the louder the surroundings, the more it will amplify the sounds the vessel will produce.

But what exactly are we hearing? Are we really listening to the sound of the waves? While some may say that it is the air flowing through the shell that causes the shore-like sound, the more likely explanation is that you are hearing the ambient noise around you. As you hold the seashell to your ear, the soundwaves resulting from the noise are captured within the shell, where they bounce around and resonate, creating the sound that you hear. Whether you were in New York City, Arizona, or anywhere else, you would still be able to hear these sounds that emanate from within the shell.

An interesting concept, it can be presented in many ways, such as by simply listening to the magic of rolling waves or discussing how this process works with your children. That is the beauty of the phenomenon: it is something that can be experienced, enjoyed, and explained in whatever way we choose.

Spending time at the beach is a wonderful way to explore nature and to enjoy being with family and friends. Along with the many photographs that you take, you may want to bring back more memories of days spent at the shore. If so, scoop up a bit of soft white sand to display in a beautiful clear glass vase, along with a few pieces of driftwood and a stunning shell. Now, all that is missing are the sounds of the waves, so go ahead and pick up that shell!
