



## ENLARGED PROSTATE: NEW TREATMENT OPTIONS FOR MEN

Benign prostatic hyperplasia, also known as BPH, is enlargement of the prostate gland that causes obstruction of the bladder that can lead to significant urinary symptoms, bladder damage, life-long catheter, and kidney failure. Most men will experience symptoms in their life, especially as they age. Eighty percent of men over 70 years of age are impacted by this disease. This leads to men having symptoms such as getting up frequently at night to urinate; daytime frequency and urgency of urine; difficulty passing urine or starting their stream; and even leakage of urine, all of which can be frustrating for many men and impact their quality of life.

**U**rologists are experts in this area and can help determine options for management based on an exam and other tests. Prescription medication is an option to help men who encounter issues with urination, but they are lifelong, can have significant side effects, or may be ineffective.

Several procedures to help men are available. Historically, the inside channel of the prostate would be opened up to relieve the blockage. This is still a good option for many men, and the advancement in technology has improved outcomes for men. Recently however, several minimally invasive procedures have been developed for BPH.

Rezūm is a new procedure that uses water vapor to remove the enlarged prostate tissue. This is an outpatient procedure with minimal risks of complications and excellent results.

Not every prostate is the same and based on the size and shape can determine what options will work the best. Big prostates may

not be candidates for standard therapy such as UroLift or Rezūm. Holmium laser enucleation of the prostate (HoLEP) is a surgery that only a few dozen urologists do in the country that can treat any size prostate, including large prostates that would typically require an invasive surgery. With the HoLEP, these large prostates can be treated without any incisions and recovery is quicker.
